Although we sing "Joy to the World" at Christmas when we remember Jesus' birth, Easter gives us many more joyful hymns to celebrate Jesus' resurrection. The Easter season lasts for 50 joyful days—more days of joy than the 40 somber days of Lent—a "week of weeks" to give thanks for the power of God that conquers even death.

Ash Wednesday coincided with Valentine's Day this year, providing an extra emphasis on the traditional Lenten discipline of charity (love). Our Wednesday night worshippers studied the different ways that God calls us to love and worked faithfully to create art—colorful hearts that were transformed into butterflies to bring a little visual joy to the sanctuary for Easter.

Butterflies have long been used as a symbol of the resurrection; we picture a caterpillar's life transformed in the cocoon from creepy crawling to fanciful flying. They are not merely reawakened, as hibernating animals are; they are changed into something different. Resurrection is not part of a predictable cycle; it's what breaks the cycle to create something new. Our acts of love, during Lent or any time, help transform this world.

Where do you see hope for resurrection in your life and in this world? What might the God who brought new life out of death renew in you? What transformation might God bring about that would leave you shouting for joy?

May the hope of God's renewing power bring you peace and joy in this season of new life.

In the opening article in the April issue of Stewardship there is a Scripture verse that woke me up. The verse is from the Old Testament and written by the prophet Haggai. Speaking on behalf of God, here is what God said to the Jews who were about to build a temple in which to worship: "The silver is mine, and the gold is mine, says the Lord." The writer of the 24th psalm made the same point when he wrote: "The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it." So that compels us to ask, if ultimately God's owns everything, where does that leave us?

The answer Scripture gives us is very clear. We are care takers of God's earth and all that is in it. We are stewards, or managers, who have the responsibility of caring for the earth and for whatever God blesses us with. Not only responsible for this earth, but our bodies, minds, and the resources that come our way. Because ultimately what we say is ours is not ours at all.

There is an old joke about two men standing on a street corner when a funeral procession came into view. They were respectfully silent until they noticed that somehow a Brinks truck had gotten right behind the hearse. That was when one fellow said to the other, "Who says you can't take it with you?" Well, the sober truth is we really can't take it with us. Yet there is a lot we can do with what God allows us to manage right now. We are the servants of the Lord. So let's be the best caretakers of whatever the Lord has placed before us.

Prayer: Dear Lord, you have given us such great responsibilities. Please give us the guidance and strength to do what we can do for your Kingdom! **Amen.**

Welcome to the Family of St. Matthew through Letter of transfer, Don and Christine Bulger on Sunday, March 17, 2024.



Our Congregational Council has called a special Congregational Meeting for Sunday, April 7, immediately following the conclusion of worship, in accordance with Section C10.02 of our Constitution

The sole business to be conducted at that meeting will be a vote regarding a proposal by the Property Committee to contract with Snowberger Construction LLC of Martinsburg to remove the existing concrete porch, ramp, steps and a portion of the sidewalk at the Maple Street entrance. They will then install a new concrete porch, steps, and ramp. The ramp will be wider with dual railings to bring it into ADA compliance.

The Property Committee solicited five bids for this work, as follows:

- Snowberger Construction LLC. \$10,935.00
- Cordell Construction \$11,600.00
- □ Valley View Builders \$12,065.00
- Dwayne Smith Construction \$12,475.00
- Ralph J Albarano No Bid

Upon the removal of the worn carpet at the Maple Street entrance for replacement last summer, it was determined that the concrete underneath the carpet was deteriorating and would need replaced. Upon consultation with Russell Dickson of RGD Engineering, the Property Committee made a proposal for the necessary work. At March's meeting, the Council expressed unanimous support for the Property Committee's proposal.

THIRD CENTURY FUND (ENDOWMENT FUND)

The Third Century Fund had a good earnings year in 2023 and as a result has \$6,072.30 for distribution in 2024. You or your committee may request funding in writing by contacting Laura Orczeck, chairperson, or committee members Allen Kuster, Barb Wilt, Beth Garner or Pastor Traci.

Deadline to submit a request is Sunday, May 26, 2024. Funds will be distributed in June 2024.

The following is from the by-laws of the Third Century Fund and outline the guidelines for fund requests.

PURPOSE

The St. Matthew Evangelical Lutheran Church Mission Endowment Fund is established to encourage responsible Christian stewardship and to promote the mission of the congregation. In response to God's love and mercy, the Endowment Fund seeks to enhance and expand the mission outreach objectives of St. Matthew Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Members and friends of St. Matthew congregation are encouraged to practice responsible Christian Stewardship by making contributions to the Endowment Fund. There are a variety of ways such gifts can be made such as, Cash, Securities, Bequests through wills or living trusts, Life insurance policies, charitable gift annuity and Life estates.

The Endowment Fund provides financial support for the church in a manner that is separate from the expenditures normally funded by the annual operating budget of the congregation.

USE OF THE FUND

All contributions to the St. Matthew Lutheran Church Endowment Fund will be undesignated and added to the principal balance of the fund. The Endowment fund principal balance will be retained and only the dividend income will be used for annual disbursements.

Consideration for awarding fund requests will be given using the following guidelines.

1. Youth of all ages - scholarship support of congregational members and their children; for youth events, for church camps or similar Christian programs and education.

2. Christian outreach ministries and missions of St. Matthew Lutheran Church, its members and the ELCA.

- 3. Worship and Music support for the worship of St, Matthew.
- 4. Capital Projects major renovations or building projects of St. Matthew.
