Dear People of God:

Between a week away for continuing education and a string of rainy days, Otto and I took an abnormally long break from hiking in May. When we returned to the trail, the transformation was too dramatic to miss; I was amazed by how full the lush green forest had grown in such a short time—not really more plants, but renewed growth of the plants that were already there. (I'm amazed at how rapidly the weeds grow at my house as well, but that's a different story).

In June, we'll settle into the long liturgical season that is represented by green, the color of growth. In the church, we often speak about growth in terms of numbers: how many more people join a congregation or attend worship. But equally important is the growth that happens within individuals: how much more kindness, patience, love, joy, peace, mercy, self-control, and generosity are manifested in those of us who are already part of the faith community.

Although this season of growth is symbolized in green, summer begins with the fiery red of Pentecost—God sending the Holy Spirit to inspire, enliven, and equip the first apostles. Their transformation made the spread of the gospel possible: the church grew to include people from all over the world because visitors to Jerusalem witnessed the power of God in the disciples.

As folks take much needed and well deserved summer vacations, we can be tempted to look at smaller Sunday gatherings and worry about growth in terms of numbers. Instead, let's try digging deeper to grow our own spiritual fruit; see if that transformation doesn't make our neighbors take notice and maybe even join us on this spiritual adventure we call the baptized life.

A Stewardship Minute June 2025

Johann Sebastian Bach, the great German composer, was also an organist who played in the church of St. Thomas in Leipzig for many years. Amazingly, he also wrote the music for the choir. His sacred compositions number in the hundreds and many are still played by organists and sung by choirs in our time. Bach was a faithful steward of the musical talent God had given him. And that compels us to consider whether each of us uses the talent or talents God has given us.

I suspect that many among us may be asking "What talent? When God passed out talents I must have been overlooked." To any of you who feel that way, I say, "Yes you do. Believe me, you just need to think of how you can serve God in many ways."

Let's begin with menial chores that need to be done around the church. Did you ever see what happens after worship each Sunday? Well, some volunteers walk through the sanctuary to pick up items left behind and Bibles that need to be picked up and taken to the church office.

The article in *Stewardship* points out that each of us needs to let God use us to do the work of the church, to help work on behalf of the Kingdom of God; that each of us should be a "human instrument letting God use us." Surely we can let God have a healthy portion of our time, talent, and resources to further the work of God's church. That is what stewardship is all about.

Prayer: Dear Lord, awaken us to the opportunities we can respond to on behalf of your Kingdom. In Christ's name. **Amen**
